*Day 43: Numbers 34-36; Deuteronomy 1-2*

In Numbers 36, guidelines are set for the daughters of Zelophehad regarding inheritance. How might these guidelines reflect God's concern for justice and fairness in society, and how can these principles apply to your life?

Consider the victories over Sihon and Og in Deuteronomy 2-3. How might the Israelites' conquests teach you about God's power and provision in overcoming obstacles in your life?



As the Israelites reflect on the past in Deuteronomy 2, they also move forward. How can a healthy balance between reflection on the past and looking toward the future contribute to your spiritual growth?

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## Day 44: Deuteronomy 3-7
