Bible In a Year Reading Plan

Day 85 : 1 Kings 10-14

Consider the significance of the Queen of Sheba's visit to Solomon in 1 Kings 10. How does her recognition of Solomon's wisdom and the splendor of his kingdom point to the importance of seeking and honoring God's wisdom in our lives?

Explore Solomon's decline into idolatry and disobedience in 1 Kings 11. How does Solomon's story serve as a warning about the dangers of compromising our faith and following after worldly desires?

Consider God's mercy in preserving a remnant for the sake of His covenant promises despite the division of the kingdom in 1 Kings 11-14. How does God's faithfulness to His promises encourage you to trust in His provision and grace?



Bible In A Year Reading Plan

Day 86: 1 Kings 15-19

Reflect on King Asa's faithfulness and reforms in 1 Kings 15-16. How does Asa's commitment to removing idols and restoring worship of the true God inspire you to pursue spiritual renewal in your own life and community? Explore God's provision for Elijah during his time of famine and despair in 1 Kings 17-19. How does God's faithfulness in sustaining Elijah's life and ministry demonstrate His care for His faithful servants even in the midst of adversity?

Consider Elisha's call and ministry as Elijah's successor in 1 Kings 19. How does Elisha's willingness to leave everything behind and follow Elijah challenge you to respond wholeheartedly to God's call on your life?



Bibe In A Year Reading Plan

Day 87: 1 Kings 20 - 2 Kings 2

Reflect on King Ahab's conflict with Ben-Hadad and God's deliverance of Israel in 1 Kings 20. How does God's victory over the enemy nations demonstrate His sovereignty and power to intervene on behalf of His people?

Explore Elijah's prophecy against Ahab and Jezebel in 1 Kings 21-22. How does God's judgment against Ahab for his wickedness underscore the principle of divine justice and accountability?

Consider Elijah's departure and Elisha's inheritance of his mantle in 2 Kings 2. How does this transition of leadership highlight the continuity of God's prophetic ministry and His faithfulness to raise up new leaders to carry out His purposes?



Bible In A Year Reading Plan

Day 88: 2 Kings 3-7

Consider the stories of the widow's oil and the Shunammite woman's son in 2 Kings 4. How do these accounts of God's supernatural provision and restoration reveal His care for the faithful and His ability to work miracles in everyday life?

Explore the story of Naaman's healing from leprosy in 2 Kings 5. How does Naaman's encounter with the God of Israel and his subsequent faith demonstrate God's desire to extend His grace and salvation to all people, regardless of their background or status?

Reflect on Gehazi's greed and deception in 2 Kings 5-7. How does Gehazi's punishment for his sin serve as a warning about the dangers of covetousness and dishonesty?

Day 89: 2 Kings 8-12

Reflect on Elisha's prophecies and miracles in 2 Kings 8-10. How do these accounts demonstrate God's faithfulness to His promises and His ability to bring about justice and judgment upon the wicked?

Explore the story of Athaliah's reign and Joash's restoration to the throne in 2 Kings 11-12. How does God's preservation of the Davidic line through Joash illustrate His faithfulness to fulfill His covenant promises?

Consider the reigns of Jehoahaz and Jehoash in Israel and Judah in 2 Kings 13-14. How do these accounts highlight the consequences of leadership that fails to seek God's guidance and uphold His commands?
