Day 99: 1 Chronicles 13-17

Reflect on the significance of David's attempt to bring the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem in 1 Chronicles 13. How does this event teach us about the importance of seeking God's guidance and following His commands in our worship and service?

Day 101: 1 Chronicles 23-27
