

Bible In A Year Reading Plan

Day 106: 2 Chronicles 9-13

Reflect on Solomon's wisdom and wealth as described in 2 Chronicles 9. How does Solomon's example challenge you to seek wisdom from God above all else, and how can you steward your resources in a way that honors Him?

Consider the significance of the Queen of Sheba's visit to Solomon in 2 Chronicles 9. How does her recognition of Solomon's wisdom and the splendor of his kingdom point to the importance of seeking and honoring God's wisdom in our lives?

Consider God's mercy in preserving a remnant for the sake of His covenant promises despite the division of the kingdom in 2 Chronicles 12-13. How does God's faithfulness to His promises encourage you to trust in His provision and grace?

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Day 107: 2 Chronicles 14-18

Reflect on King Asa's faithfulness and reforms in 2 Chronicles 14-16. How does Asa's commitment to removing idols and restoring worship of the true God inspire you to pursue spiritual renewal in your own life and community?

Consider the prophet's rebuke of Asa and his subsequent response in 2 Chronicles 16. How does Asa's reliance on human alliances instead of trusting in God's power challenge you to prioritize faith over worldly strategies in times of difficulty?



Consider Jehoshaphat's ill-fated alliance with King Ahaziah of Israel in 2 Chronicles 20-21. How does Jehoshaphat's compromise with an ungodly ruler serve as a cautionary tale about the dangers of aligning ourselves with those who do not honor God?

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Day 108: 2 Chronicles 19-23

Reflect on Jehoshaphat's judicial reforms and the appointment of judges in 2 Chronicles 19. How does the establishment of justice and righteousness in the land contribute to the flourishing of God's kingdom among His people?

Reflect on the evil reign of Queen Athaliah in Judah in 2 Chronicles 22. How does Athaliah's usurpation of power and persecution of the royal heirs serve as a reminder of the consequences of ungodly leadership and the importance of preserving God's covenant promises?

Consider the role of the high priest Jehoiada in restoring Joash to the throne and initiating reforms in Judah in 2 Chronicles 23. How does Jehoiada's faithful leadership and commitment to the worship of the true God inspire you to stand firm for righteousness in your own sphere of influence?

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Day 109: 2 Chronicles 24-28

Consider Joash's apostasy and the prophetic warning of judgment against him in 2 Chronicles 24. How does Joash's betrayal of God's covenant and rejection of divine correction serve as a cautionary tale about the consequences of spiritual infidelity?

Reflect on King Uzziah's prosperity and subsequent pride in 2 Chronicles 26. How does Uzziah's presumption in usurping the role of the priests and offering incense before God serve as a warning about the dangers of arrogance and self-exaltation?

Consider King Jotham's faithfulness and victory over the Ammonites in 2 Chronicles 27. How does Jotham's commitment to walking in the ways of the Lord lead to blessing and success in his reign, illustrating the rewards of obedience to God's commands?

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Day 110: 1 Chronicles 29-33

Consider the celebration of the Passover under Hezekiah's leadership in 2 Chronicles 30. How does the observance of this sacred feast symbolize God's deliverance and redemption, and how can you commemorate His faithfulness in your own life?

Reflect on King Manasseh's repentance and restoration to the throne in 2 Chronicles 33. How does Manasseh's turnaround from idolatry and wickedness to humility and seeking God's favor demonstrate the extent of God's mercy and forgiveness?
