

# Bible In a Year Reading Plan

## Day 113 : 2 Chronicles 34-Ezra 2

In 2 Chronicles 34, King Josiah leads a revival after God's Word is rediscovered. How does this story encourage you to engage with the Bible?

Explore Ezra's return to Jerusalem and his mission to teach the Law in Ezra 7. How does Ezra's example of prioritizing the study and teaching of Scripture encourage you to deepen your understanding of God's word and share it with others?

Consider the importance of remembering and celebrating God's faithfulness in the midst of challenges and trials as seen in the genealogies and the rebuilding of the temple in Ezra 2. How can you cultivate a spirit of gratitude and praise for God's provision and protection in your own life?

# Bible In A Year Reading Plan

## Day 114: Ezra 3-7

Reflect on the rebuilding of the altar and the foundation of the temple in Ezra 3-4. How does the restoration of worship and sacrifice symbolize the renewal of the covenant relationship between God and His people?

The Israelites rebuild the temple in Ezra 3-7, but face opposition. What does this teach you about perseverance in your own faith journey?

Consider the emphasis on obedience to God's law and separation from foreign influences in Ezra 7. How does Ezra's commitment to living according to God's commands challenge you to prioritize obedience and holiness in your own life?

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## Day 115: Ezra 8- Nehemiah 2

Consider Ezra's prayer of confession for the sins of the people in Ezra 9. How does Ezra's humility and intercession on behalf of the nation model the importance of acknowledging and repenting of sin in seeking God's mercy and forgiveness?

Explore Nehemiah's prayer for the restoration of Jerusalem's walls and the rebuilding of the city in Nehemiah 1. How does Nehemiah's burden for the welfare of God's people and the honor of His name inspire you to pray fervently for the needs of others and the advancement of God's kingdom?



Consider the unity and determination of the people as they begin the work of rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem in Nehemiah 3. How does the cooperation and collaboration of various individuals and groups reflect the strength and effectiveness of working together for a common goal?

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## Day 116: Nehemiah 3-7

Consider the opposition faced by Nehemiah and the builders as they work on the walls of Jerusalem in Nehemiah 4. How does Nehemiah's response to ridicule and threats demonstrate the importance of perseverance and reliance on God's strength in the face of adversity?

Reflect on the public reading and exposition of the Law of Moses in Nehemiah 8. How does the people's response of repentance, weeping, and rejoicing upon hearing God's word challenge you to prioritize the study and application of Scripture in your own life?



Consider the covenant renewal ceremony and commitment to obedience among the people in Nehemiah 9-10. How does the people's pledge to follow God's commands and honor His statutes inspire you to rededicate yourself to living a life of faithfulness and obedience to God?

What other insights did you gain from reading these chapters? Share your thoughts in the comment section.

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## *Day 117: Nehemiah 8-12*

Reflect on the observance of the Feast of Tabernacles and the joyous celebration of God's goodness in Nehemiah 8-9. How does the people's participation in this festival of thanksgiving and remembrance inspire you to cultivate a heart of gratitude and praise for God's faithfulness in your own life?

Reflect on the service of thanksgiving and the dedication of offerings in Nehemiah 12. How does the people's commitment to supporting the work of the temple and the ministry of the Levites demonstrate their devotion to God and His service?

Consider Nehemiah's efforts to guard against compromise and maintain the sanctity of the Sabbath in Nehemiah 13. How does Nehemiah's vigilance in upholding God's commands challenge you to remain steadfast in your commitment to holiness and obedience to God's word?
