Day 21: Jeremiah 5-8

In Jeremiah 6:10, the people are described as having closed ears. How can you cultivate a more attentive and obedient attitude towards God's word?

Jeremiah 7:4 warns against false security in religious rituals without true devotion. How can you ensure that your faith is genuine and not just based on outward practices?



Reflect on Jeremiah 8:18-22, where God expresses His grief over the people's suffering. How does understanding God's compassion for His people deepen your relationship with Him?

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Day 212: Jeremiah 9-12
