Day 225: Jeremiah 45-48

In Jeremiah 45:2-5, God addresses Baruch's fears and reassures him. How does this passage encourage you to trust God's care and promises during times of personal struggle?

Reflect on the judgment against Moab in Jeremiah 48. What does this teach you about God's justice, and how can you respond to His call for righteousness in your own life?

Jeremiah 47 speaks of the downfall of proud nations. How can you cultivate humility in your own life and avoid the pitfalls of pride?



Day 226: Jeremiah 49-52

In Jeremiah 50-51, Babylon's fall is foretold. How does this prophecy of God's judgment on a powerful nation encourage you to trust in His ultimate justice?

Jeremiah 51:5 emphasizes God's faithfulness to Israel and Judah despite their sins. How does this assurance of God's faithfulness strengthen your faith in His promises?

Reflect on the repeated calls for repentance throughout these chapters. How can you incorporate a practice of regular repentance in your spiritual life?



Day 227: Lamentations 1-4

Reflect on the laments in Lamentations 1. How can expressing your grief and sorrow to God, as seen in these laments, help you cope with personal pain and loss?

In Lamentations 2, the author openly expresses anguish and questions. How can you bring your honest emotions and questions to God in prayer, trusting that He hears and understands?

Reflect on Lamentations 3:24-26, which emphasizes waiting on the Lord. How can you seek and find hope in God's presence during difficult times?



Day 228: Lamentations 5- Ezekiel 3

In Lamentations 5, the community cries out for restoration. How can you seek God's restoration in areas of your life that are broken or in need of healing?

Reflect on Ezekiel 1, where Ezekiel has a vision of God's glory. How does this vision of God's majesty and power influence your understanding of who God is?

In Ezekiel 2-3, God commissions Ezekiel to speak to a rebellious people. How can you find courage and purpose in your own mission to share God's message, even when facing resistance?



Day 229: Ezekiel 4-7

In Ezekiel 6, God pronounces judgment on Israel but also speaks of mercy for the remnant. How does this balance of judgment and mercy help you understand God's character more fully?

Ezekiel 7 describes the consequences of Israel's sins. How can you practice regular self-examination and confession to maintain a right relationship with God?

Reflect on the repeated emphasis on God's holiness in these chapters. How does recognizing God's holiness impact your worship and daily conduct?
