Day 253: Hosea 8-11

In Hosea 11, God's love for Israel is described as that of a parent for a child. How does this image of God's tender love for you change your understanding of His character and how He relates to you? Hosea warns against the worship of idols. How can you identify and remove any modern-day "idols" in your life that might be taking the place of God?

Despite Israel's unfaithfulness, God promises restoration. How does this promise of restoration give you hope for your own spiritual journey, especially when you feel distant from God?



Day 254: Hosea 12-Joel 1

Hosea 12 recounts the history of Jacob as a lesson for Israel. How can reflecting on the lessons from biblical history help you grow in your faith and avoid repeating mistakes? Joel's prophecy shows how a nation can turn to God in times of crisis. How can you respond with faith rather than fear when you face difficult circumstances?

Joel calls the people to fast and pray in response to the disaster. How can fasting and prayer become powerful tools in your own spiritual life when seeking God's guidance and intervention?



Day 255: Joel 2-Amos 2

Joel 2 speaks of the coming "Day of the Lord." How does this concept challenge you to live with a sense of urgency and readiness for Christ's return?

Joel 2:28-29 prophesies the outpouring of God's Spirit on all people. How can you seek to experience more of the Holy Spirit's presence and power in your life today?

Amos 1-2 highlight God's concern for social justice. How does this challenge you to reflect on your own actions and attitudes toward others, especially those who are marginalized or oppressed?



Day 256: Amos 3-6

In Amos 5, God rejects Israel's superficial worship. How can you ensure that your worship is sincere and that your heart is aligned with God's will?

Amos warns against complacency in chapters 5-6. How can you guard against spiritual complacency in your own life and stay vigilant in your walk with God?

Amos 4-6 speak of God's discipline as a way to bring His people back to Him. How do you respond to God's discipline in your life, and how can it lead to spiritual growth?



Day 257: Amos 7- Obadiah 1

In Amos 7-9, Amos courageously delivers God's message despite opposition. How can you be bold in sharing God's truth with others, even when it's difficult or unpopular?

Amos speaks out against the exploitation and injustice of the wealthy in Israel. How can you live a life of integrity and fairness in your interactions with others, particularly in areas of business and finance?

Obadiah ends with the promise of Israel's restoration. How does the promise of restoration and victory encourage you to persevere in your faith, knowing that God has a future plan for His people?
