Day 323: 1 Corinthians 8-11

1 Corinthians 8 speaks about not letting your freedom cause others to stumble. How can you use your freedom in Christ to build others up, especially in matters of conscience or differing convictions?

1 Corinthians 10:13 tells us that God will not let us be tempted beyond what we can bear. How does this promise encourage you in the face of temptation, and how can you rely on God's strength to overcome it?

1 Corinthians 10:31 calls us to do everything for the glory of God. How can you glorify God in your daily choices—whether at work, at home, or in your relationships?



Day 324: 1 Corinthians 12-15

1 Corinthians 13 is often called the "love chapter." How can you live out this kind of selfless, Christ-like love in your relationships with family, friends, and even strangers?

In 1 Corinthians 14, Paul speaks about building up the church. How can you use your words, actions, and spiritual gifts to encourage and strengthen those around you?



Day 325: 1 Corinthians 16-2 Corinthians 3

1 Corinthians 16:1-4 speaks about the importance of setting 2 Corinthians 3:17 declares, "Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there aside offerings for God's work. How can you cultivate a heart of is freedom." In what ways can you experience greater freedom in generosity, not only in finances but in time and talents as well? your life by surrendering to the work of the Holy Spirit? Day 326 : 2 Corinthians 4-7
